## HARA holds its AGM

There was a good attendance at the Hatton Area Residents Association (HARA) AGM on 21 November, with a few new faces present as well as the regular stalwarts, and a full committee of 10 were elected to serve for the coming year. If you turn to Page 26 of the Newsletter you will see the names of the office bearers and committee members.

Following the official AGM business, Niall Mackie of Waste Services gave a presentation of the new waste collection arrangements that will be implemented in the Peterhead area in late Spring next year. This provoked lively but very positive discussion.

Issues raised during the meeting included concern at visibility of new railings outside the village hall; the continuing failure of the developer to complete pavement works at the Station Place development; concerns about the planned maintenance external painter work of council properties carried out during the summer by a contractor; and dissatisfaction with gas heating servicing arrangements. HARA is already in the process of producing a survey questionnaire that will be hand delivered to all council properties in Hatton regarding these last two issues that had already been raised with HARA prior to the AGM.

The HARA Newsletter editor, Fred Coutts, then showed the trial version of HARA's new website. This can be viewed at [www.haraonline.org.uk](http://www.haraonline.org.uk) but is still very much a work in progress.

The meeting concluded with teas, coffees and scones to refresh people before venturing out into the frosty night!




