# Hatton is getting faster!

There are exciting times ahead for Hatton and its surrounding communities. Over 646 premises in the Hatton area should already be able to access high speed fibre broadband. This is part of the Digital Scotland Superfast Broadband Programme ([www.digitalscotland.org](http://www.digitalscotland.org)), one of the most ambitious broadband projects in Europe.

## **But what does it mean for you?**

At home, fibre broadband isn't just about a faster internet connection. It's about everyone in the household being able to do their own thing, all at the same time.

For businesses, 'cloud computing', video conferencing and social media are just a few of the advantages to having faster upload and download speeds.

So whether you own a business, do all your shopping online, keep in touch with family and friends, pay your bills, book holidays, watch movies or play Minecraft; whatever you do, high speed fibre broadband will help you do it faster, better and more reliably than before, and all at the same time!

## **So what do you need to do?**

If you want to benefit from high speed internet connectivity, you need to act – you won't be upgraded to fibre speeds automatically. But it only takes a few easy steps:

1. See whether fibre broadband is available for your home or business by checking your telephone number at:

2. If fibre is available, you will need to contact a communications provider (a company who provides telephone, broadband or TV services) to order fibre broadband. This can be your existing provider or you can choose a new one. If you need some advice on how to choose the best provider, Ofcom has some price comparison sites which may help.

Universal Credit has now been introduced to the Peterhead area. Single claimants who are unemployed and looking for work will be asked to

claim Universal Credit instead of Jobseekers Allowance. Universal Credit will eventually replace 6 existing benefits: Jobseekers Allowance, Income Support, Employment and Support Allowance, Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit, Housing Benefit.

One of the aims is to simplify the system and make it easier for people to move back into work. Aberdeenshire Council has been working closely with the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) to support claimants with the changes taking place.

### **Digital Support**

Universal Credit is claimed online. To help people who may have difficulty accessing or using a computer, Aberdeenshire Council will be providing personal support in various locations throughout the area. Computers are available at our local Libraries A full list of where to get help using a computer is available on the Aberdeenshire Council website.

### **Money Advice**

Universal Credit also aims to encourage financial responsibility by introducing a monthly payment which includes help towards housing costs. Claimants are expected to budget on a monthly basis, similar to those who are working and being paid a salary.

Following a claim for Universal Credit, claimants will be invited to their local Jobcentre for an interview. Aberdeenshire Council will offer support to claimants who require personal budgeting support or general money advice.

There is a story that the clock which once adorned the spire of the West Kirk in Hatton had originally been located in the steading of Aldie Farm. Sadly it can only be a story. There certainly is a round hole in the steading where once there may have been a clock, but that hole is only 18 inches wide. The clock face from the Kirk is about 4 ft 6 ins. The Church still has the receipt from 1895 (10 years after the opening of the church) when the clock and the bell were added to the spire at a cost of £140.

But there is a connection with Aldie. In 1854 the Free Church Minister in Cruden, Rev George Brown, married May, the daughter of James Shepherd who farmed Aldie. The same Mr Shepherd kindly granted a feu of about two acres to the Free Church in Hatton for a nominal yearly rent of £1.

Mr Brown soon moved to Edinburgh where he lived until he retired back to the area and built Longhaven House. During his lifetime Mr Brown was proprietor of the estates of Longhaven, Aldie and Auchlethen.

## Home Energy Advice Team – HEAT

Do you know what the term “fuel poverty” means? Many think it is something to do with people who are receiving a benefit of one kind of another, but they would be wrong. Fuel poverty is something that anyone could find themselves in – even if they are working and have a decent wage, as the type of house you live in could be a major factor.

The actual definition of fuel poverty is that you spend over 10% of your income on energy bills. So if you live in a hard to heat home, and many older granite houses come into that category, you may well be over the fuel poverty threshold.

If you find your home hard to heat, if you are finding your fuel bills are expensive, then the Home Energy Advice Team (HEAT) can help. They specialise in offering personal, tailored advice and information to help householders enjoy a warm home while lowering their fuel bills. They provide free home visits and telephone advice, and can help you in several ways:

- Showing you the most effective way to use your heating controls
- Identify condensation, damp and the potential for energy efficiency in your home
- Help to switch tariff or supplier to get the best deal for your circumstances
- Help to set up your fuel supplier account
- Provide advice to help you understand your fuel bills.

And if you live off the gas network, there may be interest free loans available to help to insulate your house.

The HEAT team work with all tenures, so whether you rent or own your home you may be able to benefit.
