Improving our environment

Brian Shand's talk at the HARA AGM on "Aberdeenshire's Biodiversity Planning" highlighted what other villages in Buchan have done to improve their surroundings.

Our small area of Aberdeenshire is home to many amazing plants, animals and birds. By caring for our natural heritage we can improve our quality of life and enjoyment for our children and our children's children.

Within Hatton there are numerous public areas that could be environmentally improved. A village street plan provided by Brian is available to view on the village notice board. The public areas are coloured pink. (If you would prefer a personal copy please request this using the contact details below.)

We received several suggestions on the night including planting a community orchard, communal allotment, cherry trees along Station Road and Park View and removing some of the grassed areas and replanting with bee and butterfly friendly plants. All of these were in addition to the sterling work Hatton in Bloom volunteers already do to enhance the village.

Some funding may be available. Regardless, Aberdeenshire Council Landscape Department would be happy to support us.

HARA now needs your views on all of the above, along with any other ideas you might have. We will then feedback to Brian Shand for consideration by Aberdeenshire Council.

HARA currently undertakes the following:

- Set up of a 'Repair Café' to be run by residents for residents
- Child health concerns; school bus diesel fumes
- Infrastructure repairs identified and co-ordinated by regular 'Council Walkabouts'

Fairtrade – not just bananas!



Everybody knows about Fairtrade bananas, but if you look in local shops and Fairtrade outlets, you'll see that there is a large range of foodstuffs available from all round the world.

Hot drinks – Fairtrade teas, coffees, both ground and instant, in a range of strengths and flavours from Africa and South America - are available in most supermarkets and from the local Fairtrade group. Fairtrade cocoa and hot chocolate can be bought locally, as can sugar. As for cold drinks on hot summer days, there are fruit juices and coconut water.

South Africa and South America produce a number of Fairtrade wines which you can also buy in our area.

Confectionery - Divine chocolate lives up to it's name – dark, milk and white chocolate with added flavours like orange, mint, strawberry. There are also sweets of many kinds such as mints, fudge and jelly beans – all delicious and all Fairtrade. Just look for the Fairtrade or Traidcraft logos.

Our local group recently had a coffee morning in New Deer where we sold many different kinds of goods in addition to most of the ones already mentioned - such as cereals, snacks, biscuits, sauces, jams and honey, dried fruit and ...clothing, jewellery, cleaning products, candles, bags and more...much more!

Data Protection Changes

As you may be aware, on the 25 May 2018 the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into force replacing the Data Protection Act 1998. The new Regulation gives individuals more rights and control over how their personal data is handled by organisations'

There is no particular impact on small voluntary organisations such as HARA. The data kept by HARA simply comprises the following:

Names and contact details of the HARA Committee Members

Names and contact details of related organisations and those that we do business with (eg Hall Committee; advertisers in our Newsletter)

Names of attendees at our AGM for purposes of the Minute of the Meeting

Names and contact details of residents who approach HARA with an issue to be dealt with

Name, address and contact details of those who register to use the Tool Library

With the exception of residents wanting HARA to pursue some matter with Aberdeenshire Council or other external organisations, where contact details may require to be forwarded on by the very nature of the request, data kept is only for HARA's internal use.

Anyone wishing their name removed from the register of Tool Library users, please contact us to arrange.
