SCOTTISH RURAL PARLIAMENT



The Scottish Rural Parliament takes place every two years. (www.scottishruralparliament.org.uk) It brings people working, volunteering and representing rural communities together directly with policy makers and influencers to explore solutions to a range of rural challenges and to look at opportunities for community led solutions. Topics of discussion at these events have included health service provision, future rural policy, rural gender pay gap and supporting refugees in rural areas; as well as more typical rural concerns such as land based industries, connectivity and rural housing.

HARA was invited to the 2018 Rural Parliament. We met in Stranraer with over 400 people representing rural Scotland, from host region Dumfries and Galloway in the south to Orkney in the north for what was thought to be Scotland's largest participatory democratic event. Delegates' expertise was also shared from international representatives attending from Ireland, Finland, the Netherlands and England. A number of young community representatives and youth organisations also took part, reflecting 2018 being Scotland's Year of Young People. (Turn to Page 3)

THE WORK OF HARA

HARA relies on people giving up a small amount of time to make Hatton not just a good but a GREAT place to live in.

- Establishing an official play area for dogs and dog owners
- Set up of a 'Repair Café' to be run by residents for residents
- Child health concerns; school bus diesel fumes
- Infrastructure repairs identified and co-ordinated by regular 'Council Walkabouts'

The twin themes of the 2018 Scottish Rural Parliament were Brexit and empowering communities to “Take Action”.

Mairi Gougeon MSP, Minister for Rural Affairs and the Natural Environment, opened the Rural Parliament on Wednesday 14th November.

The 3-day event allowed HARA to visit the forty or so exhibitors, take part in discussion and debate and gather information through networking with individuals and groups from other rural communities. Through this we were delighted to hear that the “Hatton Repair Café” instigated and run by Ruth Bone is one of only three in Scotland. (See page 13) The other two being in Glasgow and Edinburgh. A big pat on the back for Ruth!

We visited Portpatrick. It was interesting to find that the entire community there had been involved in a shares issue to purchase and run the harbour. We were also informed that this is where the EU border would be in case of any Northern Ireland “Backstop” via current Brexit negotiations!

The remaining time was designed to empower all delegates to take action in their own communities, to harness rural Scotland’s knowledge and expertise and to inform post-Brexit policy decisions. Our rural landscape often poses some unique challenges and this is added to by the uncertainties of Brexit. Our rural economy is often heavily dependent on EU funding, particularly the Common Agricultural Policy, and the impact on our communities could be great if this funding is not replaced.

In addition our own Council-specific EU funded programmes, such as LEADER are also affected. Obviously further work is needed by government ministers to establish other funding sources. This will prove challenging, given the current vagueness and insecurities surrounding Brexit.

By coming together at the Scottish Rural Parliament we were able to produce a post Brexit policy statement* that we felt would benefit all rural communities in Scotland. This was presented to Michael Russell MSP, Cabinet Secretary for Government Business and Constitutional Relations at the closing ceremony on Friday 18th November.

PROPOSED CLOSURE OF THE HATTON RECYCLING (SKIP) POINT

HARA invited a senior member of Aberdeenshire Council's Transport & Infrastructure team to speak on the proposed closure of the site. As there seems to be some confusion as to why this is the case and also with regard to proposed changes to bin collection procedures, I have tried to summarise the relevant information below. This is accurate at the current time.

Background

Most people will be aware that all Councils in the UK have been forced to reduce spending as the grant funding provided by the Westminster Government has been reduced over a number of so called "austerity" years. During this time councils were also restricted in terms of the money they could raise via Council Tax. Services have therefore had to be cut and these reductions continue with Aberdeenshire having to reduce spend in the forthcoming tax year by approximately £10 million.

Waste that goes to landfill costs each and every taxpayer a total between £110 and £140 per tonne. Of this, £81 per tonne is landfill tax and this goes back to the Westminster government via HMRC. The landfill tax component will rise to £91 from April.

Hatton Recycling Point

Hatton produces an average of 175 tonnes of waste at the site each year. Only 8% can be recycled. The remaining 92% goes to landfill. This compares with around 50,000 tonnes at other larger recycling points where almost 50% can be recycled. Hatton along with Whitehills are the two smallest sites in Aberdeenshire. Given the figures above they are simply the least efficient and the proposal therefore is that these two sites should be closed. Whilst there is a cost saving initially, the main objective is to increase recycling across the Shire. There simply is not enough capacity at landfill sites.

Refuse and Recycling bins

Proposals are that the grey lid (normal waste) bins be reduced to 140 litre in size for all households. (These you are probably already

aware of; most people living alone or as a couple would already have this size of bin. For these households there will be no change in bin size.) Recycling (blue lid) bins will remain the same size as is, but all households will receive two in total, ie one more.

Householders will be asked to separate waste in these two bins, with one solely for paper and cardboard. The other will be for containers; plastic, metal, tetrapacs etc. As now, there will be no collection of glass or garden waste in any of the bins. However the glass recycling point in the Hall Car Park will remain.

Households can ask for additional recycling bins and these will be provided. Households that are having severe difficulty with the size of the refuse bin can also request either a larger or additional bin but these may be subject to scrutiny before being granted.

Collections

Two proposals have been put forward;

Option 1. Is a three week cycle where each of the three bins is collected once per week, ie First Blue Bin in week one, Second Blue Bin in week two and normal refuse bin in week three. Then repeat. (Note: The green food waste bin will be collected every week.)

Option 2. Is a four weekly cycle whereby both recycling bins will be collected in week two and the normal refuse will be collected in week four. (Green food waste bins will be collected every week.)

All of the proposals, closure of sites, replacement of bins and the two collection options will be debated and voted on by councillors at the appropriate committee at their meeting on 26th January.

Regardless of how voting goes, no changes to the bins or collections will happen before 2020.

Final point; the article in the Press & Journal (Friday 14th January) suggesting that Aberdeenshire Council had performed a U-Turn over closure of recycling points does not include the Hatton or Whitehills sites. Their closure will be voted on.



HATTON RAILWAY LINE

HARA is pleased to report that the owners of the disused railway line have consented to its conversion as a permanent footpath. We owe our thanks to Mr & Mrs Craig at Bogbrae and Mr & Mrs Grubb at Mount Pleasant. HARA has instructed a local agricultural consultant to conduct a feasibility study, (this began in December) part of which will involve seeking appropriate funding sources. If funding can be found then the path would become a welcome amenity for walkers, the disabled, joggers, cyclists and horse riders along with the potential to provide a resource for the numerous children's groups in the village and surrounding area.

HARA now needs as many individuals, to include group leaders etc, regardless of how they intend to use the path, to write letters of support. These will act as necessary support in the difficult task of securing the substantial funding required. A template is shown opposite that can be altered to suit anyone willing to help us, but please feel free to write your own version. Letters should include your name and address. A90 SPEED REDUCTION

HARA requested a speed and traffic survey be conducted with a view to reducing the speed limit on the stretch of the A90 as it passes the end of Station Road. This to allow the safe passage of pedestrians to the bus stop and also traffic crossing the A90 or turning into/out of the village in both directions. A survey was carried out by BEAR (Scotland) and a report of the findings sent to Transport (Scotland) for review in August 2018. When the review is completed HARA will be informed and we will publish the findings.

Parking restrictions on Station Road

Aberdeenshire Council has contacted various public bodies including HARA, Cruden Community Council and the Police with regard to a proposed Traffic Management Order. As traffic travelling out of Hatton (toward the A90) often has restricted vision due to vehicles parked on Station Road outside the school the Order would restrict parking Monday to Friday there, opposite the shop/post office to a maximum of 45 minutes. It was felt by those of us that responded, including the community constable, that such an order could not be adequately policed. It was suggested that Aberdeenshire Council should therefore consider double yellow lines along a 36 metre length of the road as detailed above. We will aim to publish the decision of Aberdeenshire Council Roads department in due course.

SNOW WARDEN SCHEME

Aberdeenshire Council is currently inviting groups of individuals in local areas to volunteer to be part of a Volunteer Snow Warden scheme.

Volunteers will be trained and equipped by the council so that they are ready to help clear footpaths in local areas in the event of snow. The Council is asking groups of neighbours or friends to get together to form a team, nominate one of their members to be their team leader and to get ready for the snow. Snow clearing equipment and protective clothing will be provided, and the necessary training given.
