THE WORK OF HARA

HARA relies on people giving up a small amount of time to make Hatton not just a good but a GREAT place to live in.

HARA currently undertakes the following:

- Management of the Tool Library including maintenance and purchase of tools
- Notice Board upkeep
- Newsletter content and distribution
- Twice yearly Litter Picks
- Providing a voice for residents of Hatton and surrounding area
- Regular donations / sponsorship to other local groups
- Maintenance of defibrillator / training for residents
- Local Events

HARA's other contributions to the village:

- Fencing around recycling bins in the car park
- Provision of bench seating
- Initial organisation of what has now become 'Hatton in Bloom'
- Organising a "Planning for Real" event.
- Campaigning and resourcing new play equipment, aerial glide, youth shelter etc

HARA's Current Topics under discussion:

- Resident safety concerns; Speed survey – Station Road / Main Street
- Resident safety concerns; Speed restriction for A90 at its junction with Station Road
- Availability of 'Poo Bag Stations' and waste bins for dog owners use.
- Establishing an official play area for dogs and dog owners
- Set up of a 'Repair Café' to be run by residents for residents
- Child health concerns; school bus diesel fumes
- Infrastructure repairs identified and co-ordinated by regular 'Council Walkabouts'

A BUSY YEAR!

Summer is here! Let's keep our fingers crossed that the sun comes out on more days than the rain. It's the season of barbecues, sandcastles and the Hatton Gala, not to mention the 5K and 10K runs. Now that's got you all thinking I decided I would take this opportunity to go through some of the things that the village has achieved this year. We have:

- Distributed over 400 native trees for planting in and around Hatton.
- Made a successful bid for £10,440 for additional playpark equipment
- Had another 'Celebration Day' which was bigger and even better attended
- Organised another 'Walkabout' by the Council to see first-hand what we need
- Been represented at the annual Chartered Institute of Housing Conference
- Been represented at the Rural Parliament in Stranraer
- Gained support from the land-owners of the Railway Line for our proposed footpath
- Successfully bid for £3,000 to undertake the railway line feasibility study
- Completed the feasibility study
- Been represented at the third sector group Gathering in Glasgow
- Organised another successful village litter pick
- Been represented on Aberdeenshire's Tenant Participatory Forum
- Purchased new items for our ever growing Tool Library
- Ruth's Repair Café has achieved fame across Scotland and gone from strength to strength
- Hatton in Bloom have excelled themselves yet again

On a final note the final £9,600 for playpark equipment is likely to be with us in the next few weeks. That makes a total of £37,000 of funding we have raised successfully. Hopefully we will be able to install the additional playpark equipment this Summer and the weather holds so children can at last enjoy it.

The speaker at the Annual General meeting held on 11 June was Wendy Probert from the Aberdeenshire Health and Social Care Partnership. There has been a wide-ranging public engagement, encouraging people to give their views on the five key priorities identified for the 2020 to 2025 strategic plan. These are:

1. Effective use of resources
2. Prevention and early intervention
3. Re-shaping care
4. Engagement
5. Tackling inequalities and public protection

Wendy then facilitated a discussion about what we thought were the important aspects of health and social care which should be considered when the final strategic plan is prepared.

Having then heard a report by the chair on HARA's activities this year, and receiving the financial report from the treasurer, the present members of the HARA Committee were re-elected. (You can find their contact details on Page 27.)

The Parish of Cruden – Church of Scotland

Dear Friends,

Recently I paid a flying visit to Luxemburg to take part in one of the most unique intercultural and religious events in Europe. 'Run for a United World' is now celebrating its eleventh year and brings together religious leaders from all over Europe to participate in the Luxemburg Marathon Festival. In total there were over seventy of us, some running in the full marathon, some (like me) running the half marathon and others running as a team in a marathon relay. Last year I tried running the full marathon, but after 19 miles ended up in the back of an ambulance with dehydration and heat exhaustion. This year, it was even hotter but having taken the right precautions I successfully completed the 13.1 mile course without any serious aftereffects!

The curious thing about the event, is that we all disagree with each other but get on very well. Whilst the majority of participants were Christian priests and ministers (including Father Matthias Vosseler – the 'fastest priest in Europe' who completed the full marathon in 2:57:31), there were representatives of other faiths including Islam, Judaism, Buddhism and Sikhism not to mention a group of humanists from the Netherlands. It was a remarkable mixture of beliefs and cultures. In a time of increasing divisions, we were all there to make an important statement about mutual respect, tolerance and understanding.

As the local Church of Scotland parish minister I am (as you would expect) deeply committed to my faith. I believe, along with all other mainstream Christians, that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and the ultimate revelation of God. In my view nowhere else do you get a clearer insight into the mystery of God the Father than in Jesus. As such my beliefs are different from many of the people I met in Luxemburg. Yet it would be arrogant and naive to dismiss the integrity and worth of the beliefs of my running companions.

We live in challenging times. There are voices which tell us to view the stranger with suspicion and hold in contempt people whose opinions and beliefs are different from our own. Such manipulative people (whom I will not mention by name!) play upon our fears and insecurities. But there is a better way. We need to

have the integrity to be faithful and confident in our own beliefs while also having the humility to respect the beliefs of others.


