PLAYPARK UPDATE


Work started on the installation of the new play equipment for younger children in the playpark late last year. Although it was estimated to take little more than a week, work was halted within a few days. The reasons for this were twofold: Aberdeenshire Council had recently removed the old play equipment as it was in a dangerous state. Several areas of turf were removed during this operation. As the safety matting under the new equipment has to be laid on turf, this part of the work could not go ahead. Although the contractors did begin to dig and lay the footings so too did several days of rain, causing the area to become unsafe for the contractor to continue.

It was therefore decided to wait both for Aberdeenshire Council to arrange a delivery of turf and for better weather before work could be resumed.

The installation has now been re-started and most of the new play equipment has been completed. Some turfing is still to be done before the Council will inspect and deem the area to be safe for re-opening to the public. We hope this will be in the near future.

Perhaps we choose the wrong date but were limited by the other events that had already been organised. Hopefully we can arrange a more suitable date for a "re-run" in December 2020 and hope to welcome more of our fellow residents.

A90 SPEED RESTRICT UPDATE

We have finally had a response regarding our efforts to secure a speed reduction on the A90 through the village. Disappointingly we have been told that the current speed limit of 60 mph will remain. The decision was based on comparisons with three other trunk roads in Scotland that run through communities of similar size. Having checked these sites HARA remains unconvinced by the argument as none of the areas that are supposedly similar have the same level of traffic at peak times.

We sincerely hope that it does not take a pedestrian fatality for Bear (Scotland) or the Scottish Government office to look at this again. Meantime HARA will write a measured response to the decision to appeal the decision.

What can YOU do for Scotland's nature?

There are a number of simple things that you can do to give nature a helping hand to protect our biodiversity and ensure Scotland has a nature-rich future.

This winter - help wildlife! Winter can be a challenging season for wildlife with harsh weather, low temperatures and much less food around. Our winter wildlife loves lazy gardeners at this time of year, and these quick and easy tips are great ways you can help our animals and birds.

- Be a lazy gardener. Leaving some areas overgrown or filled with leaves and twigs gives insects, frogs, toads and small animals a quiet and cosy place to hide during the colder months.
- Use your food scraps. Keep a food scraps tub by your cooker - any bits suitable to feed birds and other wildlife can go straight into it. Bruised or overly-soft fruit that may otherwise go to waste – or in the compost bin – can also be left out for badgers, foxes and birds. Cut the fruit in half and leave it on the grass or spike it on a tree branch. The blackbirds will love you for it.
- Most people are aware white bread is a no-no for ducks – polluting the water and making them ill. But healthy snacks including corn – tinned, frozen, dried or fresh – lettuce and other greens cut into pieces will make you popular at your local duck pond this winter.
- Garden ponds can be a great water source for passing wildlife but, when temperatures drop, ice can be tricky. A prolonged freeze can mean problems for fish and hibernating frogs and newts. Gently crack the ice to make a hole or float a ball in the water to help stop it freezing.
- Leave your borders / herbaceous plants intact with seed heads as many insects overwinter in their hollow stems - hold off chopping till spring.
 - ◇ Stop cutting your lawn sooner rather than later as longer grass provides some refuge and protection for shrews, voles and other small mammals and invertebrates.
 - ◇ Do a bit of cleaning – empty and clean bird boxes,

- feeders and baths prior to you starting feeding over winter by using some hot water, mild detergent and a brush to help keep your visitors healthy and happy.
- ◇ It's an ideal time to put up bird boxes which can be used overwinter as shelters for small birds and with a quick clean in late winter will be ready for the nesting season.
 - ◇ Remember to check areas for wildlife before carrying out any jobs and try to leave compost heaps, leaf and log piles undisturbed.
 - ◇ Use the winter time to curl up with a cup of tea and plan how to make your garden more nature friendly.

DOG FOULING

How do I report owners who allow their dog to foul in a public place but do not clean up and dispose of the faeces?

If you have witnessed a person allowing their dog to foul in a public area, and not picking up the faeces immediately and disposing of the poop scoop in a suitable bin, you can report this to Environmental Health by telephone: 03456 08 12 07.

The information Environmental Health requires to investigate the offence is:

- The date, time and place the offence was witnessed
- The name and address of the dog owner, or, if this is not known, a description of the dog owner
- A description of the dog.
- A car registration number if the dog owner was seen to leave a vehicle to walk the dog.

This information will be passed to an authorised officer who will contact the dog owner and advise them of their legal responsibilities to clean up after their dog has fouled.

When the identity of a dog owner is not known, patrols of the area at the times you witnessed the offence may be organised.

Any information passed to the council is treated in the strictest confidence.

Alternatively, you can complete the online Dog Fouling Report Form.

What is being done about those who allow their dogs to foul public places?

Certain local authority officers are authorised under The Dog Fouling (Scotland) Act 2003 to issue fixed penalty notices to any person in charge of a dog who after it has fouled in a public place fails to immediately remove the excrement and dispose of it in a suitable receptacle (dog bin, public litter bin or their own refuse bin).

Aberdeenshire Council's authorised officers have been active in enforcing the provisions of this legislation and have served a number of fixed penalty notices.

Officers routinely carry out enforcement patrols in Aberdeenshire, and any person found committing an offence is issued with a fixed penalty notice, incurring a fine of £80. This rises automatically to £100 if it is not paid within 28 days.

A person who persistently offends, or where an officer feels that payment is unlikely to be made, may be reported under the Act to the Procurator Fiscal as an alternative to being issued a fixed penalty where the maximum fine available to the court is £500.

“CHAT” BENCH

Around two years ago a mother visiting her daughter took her grandchild out for a walk in a nearby park. She noticed an older man sitting quietly on one of the park benches. In the forty-five minutes or so she was playing with the child she noted that despite a large number of people walking past the bench not one person acknowledged the man or even stopped to say “Hello”. The woman felt saddened that so many people, isolated and alone can spend entire days without ever speaking to another person through no fault of their own. But she also realised that most of us simply feel too shy to speak to a complete stranger.

When she got home the woman took three pieces of white card and wrote on each one “CHAT BENCH. SIT HERE IF YOU DO NOT MIND SOMEONE SAYING HELLO” She then took them to her own local park and tied them to benches.

Someone posted pictures to social media and the story was also reported on a local BBC news programme. In the two years since, “Chat Benches” have appeared all over the world from as far afield as Australia and Canada as well as throughout the UK.

HARA applied for funding via the Buchan Development Partnership and was awarded a grant from the Shell Small Grants Scheme. A bench has now been made by “Woodcraft” at Aden Country Park, a scheme for adults with learning difficulties engaged in producing garden furniture. We are currently investigating a suitable site in the village and hope to install the bench very soon.

Please feel free to sit and chat especially if it’s to someone you don’t know too well. It might not make a big difference to your day, but it could completely change someone else’s.

At the time of writing I am preparing to run in the 2020 London Marathon which takes place on 26th April. The reason for undertaking such a challenging event involves a number of different factors including being slightly mad, having yet another midlife crisis and becoming eligible for my first ever bus pass in the summer. Closer to home, throughout the season of Lent (26th February to 9th April) the congregation of Cruden Parish Church is running The Community Bible Experience. The aim is to read the entire New Testament and then meet up once a week at a book club to reflect on what has surprised, puzzled and encouraged you. Whatever stage you are at in your spiritual journey, or even if you want to read the New Testament as a piece of literature, we hope to read big, read well and read together. It should be a fascinating experience. The time and location of our weekly gatherings have yet to be finalised, but we are hoping to have both a daytime and an evening group. Please contact me if you would like more details. If you want to read by yourself, I'll be posting a reading plan on the church website and Facebook page.

Finally, as well as running and reading and walking the dogs, I am

of course the local Church of Scotland Parish Minister for Hatton & Cruden and the surrounding area. 

CORONAVIRUS

If you have travelled to or from China in the last 14 days the recommendation from NHS Grampian is to **self-isolate and stay indoors and avoid contact with other people for at least 14 days.**

There is no need to contact your GP during this time if you remain symptom free.

If you develop respiratory symptoms within 14 days of travel to the area, and are now in the UK, telephone your GP or NHS 24 on 111 informing them of your symptoms and your recent travel.
